PHundraising



It's been a busy time for our club since or last newsletter was published. In the final quarter of 2010 and the first part of 2011, we've had more than a few fund raising events, including the 2010 Alzheimer's Memory Walk, our first ever PHIN Crawl, "Stars Fell

On Alabama", and by our club's Poker Run, all helping our club's charities out while putting that PHUN in fund raising!

Really good news and a pretty big number first is this year's total for "Stars Fell On Alabama": \$12,000.00. Despite the economy and the oil spill, our time over in Orange Beach raised more than we had hoped for or expected for our host clubs charities. TABPHC will be presenting our portion of that as a check to the Alzheimer's Association, Mississippi Chapter: \$3,000.00 through our club's team, PHins PHorward. We'll get credit for that through this coming November's Gulf Coast Memory Walk and be able to add it to our total for that event.

In April, we had our club birthday party and poker run. Between people buying poker hands, raffle tickets, beer skins, and gracious winners who donated back their prizes, we donated \$800.00 to the American Cancer Society. Funds from the poker run, combined with our "Relay for Life" team's efforts in Ocean Springs on April 29, totaled of \$1,035.00.



Our effort to help feed those in need, the PHeeding PHrenzy, is our ongoing collection of funds and food to benefit The Lord is My Help soup kitchen and food pantry in Ocean Springs. In 2010, we collected canned goods and food fines that let us donate a total of 314 pounds of food to help feed the hungry.

So far in 2011, we've collected \$146.75 ... so it's time to give them a call and go grocery shopping for what's needed most by the pantry. It could be anything from peanut butter to can openers. Every item that we give to them is very much appreciated.
